Town Board Minutes November 8, 2016 2017 Budget Public Hearing

The monthly meeting and public hearing on Budget 2017 of the Torrey Town Board was held on November 8, 2016 at 56 Geneva St and called to order by Supervisor Flynn at 7:30PM.

Present: Patrick Flynn, Colby Petersen, Burge Morris, Larry Martin, Peter Martini

Others present: George Thompson, Tim Chambers- Hwy Supt. Dwight James- Code Officer, Linda & Grant Downs, Dave Granzin, Mary Lilyea, Audrey & Jim Riesenberger, Jim Smith-District Legislator, Bill Crumlish

Mr. Flynn led the pledge of allegiance.

Mr. Flynn opened the public hearing on Town Budget 2017 at 7:35PM With no one desiring to comment on the budget, he went on to business.

Mr. Flynn presented the abstracts of vouchers for review.

Motion by Mr. Martini, 2nd Mr. Morris that the bills on the General A & B accounts in the amount of \$6,332.37 be paid, carried

Motion by Mr. Morris, 2nd Mr. Petersen, that the bills on the Hwy DA & DB accounts in the amount of \$4,567.42 be paid carried.

Motion by Mr. Flynn 2nd Mr. Morris to that the final installment on Fire Protection contract, in the amount of 31,000. be paid, carried

Mr. Flynn presented the Fire Contract for 2017 with the Village of Dresden for \$96,900. Motion by Mr. Petersen 2nd Mr. Morris, authorizing the Supervisor to sign the contract, carried by all.

Tim Chambers gave the Highway report. Shared services with the Village of Penn Yan, hauling millwork. Pick up has 4 new tires.

Went to Hornell and completed CHIPS application.

Torrey 2 had repairs to coolant system. Removed fallen tree on Serenity Rd.

Village of Dresden is interested in sharing town backhoe. Their backhoe is too small and plan on selling it. They would be agreeable to purchasing a clam shell bucket for the Town backhoe. Tim will research a contract agreement for this.

Village DPW Supt. Is having back surgery so Town employees will help with the leaf pickup and any street issues in his absence.

Paul Weaver of Weaver Hydraulics on Kings Hill Rd has asked that a drainage problem with the roadside ditches be looked into. He would like to install a pipe for his driveway. Water is pooling on his property instead of running down the roadway ditches. Tim will do more research to resolve the water-flow issue.

Mowing is complete; Josh Wood had a metal bar drop on his foot. They put ice packs on it. He did not go to emergency room or doctor as suggested by Tim.

Dwight James gave the Code report. 3 Building permit issued. 4 C of C, 1 AV application, 1 SUP application,3 site visits, 15 building progress inspections, 1 special incident, 1 meeting, 143 miles.

George Thompson reported that he has the petitions for Water District 1 and with clarification on a couple properties he will drop the petitions off later this week.

He quoted NYS Town Law Sec 191 Art 12 on Water Districts regarding petitions. Test one of the petition requirements; you need it signed by owners of taxable real property owning at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property in the proposed district. The second test is just of property of resident owners, not businesses, and you must have at least one-half of the assessed valuation of the taxable real property owned by resident owners.

The term resident owner does not include seasonal residents such as summer cottage owners unless they vote in the town and thus consider the residence their permanent home. So now you have to pull out the residences of full-time residents, or part-timers who vote in the town and consider the town their permanent residence, to get the total valuation of that group.

A "resident owner" does not include a corporation or similar entity.

Dave Granzin and Jim Riesenberger presented signed petitions for Perry Point Water District; they believe they have 70.2 % property owners signatures.

The assessor and town clerk will review the petitions which require certification before the Town Board can call for a public hearing.

District Legislator Jim Smith reported the Army Corp of Engineers has contacted Yates County Planner Tim Cutler about \$ 5,000,000 funding available for Rte 14 corridor water infrastructure project. This project was first introduced in 2011 but the funding went away.

Mr. Flynn closed the public hearing at 8:15pm

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Flynn, seconded Mr. Petersen, WHEREAS, This Town Board did meet at the time and place specified in the nature of the public hearing on the 2017 Preliminary Budget every person interested was heard thereof, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Torrey shall prepare and certify in duplicate copies with estimated revenues, if any, and deliver one copy thereof to the Supervisor of this Town to be presented by him to the Yates County Legislature.
