From the Desk of Town Supervisor (Peter Martini):

- Patrick Flynn retired as Town Supervisor effective December 31,2021
- Peter Martini was elected Town Supervisor on November 2,2021
- Jeremy DeLyser, engineer with Clark Peterson Lee (**CPL**), opened the bids for Water District 1 on October 27,2021. All were at least \$300,000 over the estimated cost of the project.
- Jeremy Delyser met with the Town Board on December 29,2021 to outline the next steps involving Water District 1
- A revised water agreement between the Town of Torrey and the Village of Dresden was received October 28,2021 for the Perry Point Water District (WD2)

The 2022 total Town Tax Levy represents a 2.40% increase of the 2021 Town Tax Levy mainly due to the fallout from the Pandemic

- At the January 11,2022 Town Board meeting set a date of January 25,2022 for a public hearing on Water District 1. The purpose is to discuss the bids opened on October 27,2021 and the next steps forward regarding the project.
- At the January 11,2022 Town Board meeting the Town Board appointed Bruce Henderson to fill Peter Martini's councilman seat on the Town Board until a special election is held in November of 2022 for the position.
- At the December 14,2021 Town Board meeting agreed to send the proposed Water Agreement between the Town of Torrey and Village of Dresden to the attorney with a cover letter.
- Approved and passed at the December 14,2021 town meeting amendments to the Town of Torrey Dog Kennel and Solar Law.
- A lawsuit regarding the Greenidge Data Center has been served on the Town Board, Planning Board, and Greenidge

From the Desk of Town Clerk (*Betty Daggett*):

- The Town Office is open Monday through Thursday from 9:00am - 4:00pm. Call 315-536- 6376
- Notary Public available- NoFee
- Tax Collection is in full stride, the new collection system introduced by the county in 2018 was plagued with initial glitches. The problems have been resolved, and the 2021 tax collection is running smoothly.
- This year, on the tax bills is the option to pay Town & County Taxes online at <https://www.yatescounty.org/519>, - standard processing fees will be applied, which can be substantial!
- Fee collection such as building permits, fines & fees issued by Code Office, Watershed Inspection for property sales

- Registrar of Birth / Death Certificates Vital copies - \$10.00 fee.
- Handicap Parking Permits
- Hunting / Fishing Licenses are now for sale
- Marriage License Requirements: Bride/Groom/Spouse must be present to obtain a license. The license is good for 60 days. There is a \$30 fee. Evening or Saturday appointments are available.
- Dog Licenses: State Law requires all puppies to be licensed at 4 months. At time of licensing, a rabies certificate and neuter/spay certificate must be presented. Licensing Fees: Unspayed/Unneutered \$18 and Spayed/Neutered \$10.
(It is NYS Ag & Market law- **ALL dogs** harbored in the Town of Torrey must be licensed yearly at the Town Clerk office)

From the Desk of Town Highway Superintendent (Tim Chambers):

- Off hours emergency callout number: 315-729-2706
- Paved Hewitt Road through the Consolidated Local and Highway Improvement Program (**CHIPs**) at a cost of \$100,815.64
- Checking on the costs of culvert pipe for both Long Point Road and Anthony Beach Road crossover.
- Repaired an eight (8) foot deep washout on East Leach Road
- Cleaned up the culverts on Perry Point Road which were clogged with cut wood/logs.
- Reviewed the repair work needed at the Town Park and the cost which will be submitted to Yates County for a grant in 2022.
- As a **safety** precaution, especially this time of year when snow plowing is possible, trash cans should **not** be placed on Town Roads, but rather on the right-of-way.
- *Reminder according to NYS law:*
 - + throwing trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or refuse on Highways and adjacent lands is prohibited
 - + the town superintendent of highways shall sue for and recover a penalty not to exceed \$100 from any person depositing ashes, snow, ice, stones, sticks, etc. upon

a highway or on grass or loose stones adjoining a town highway

- Pursuing Torrey Station's failure to comply with the conditions set forth in its Special Use Permit issued in January of 2021 with the Planning Board Attorney, Kathy Bennett of BSK.

From the Desk of Town Planning Board (*George Dowse*):

- Meets the third (3rd) Monday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Town Building
- Processed several standard site plan reviews, lot line adjustments, and variance requests, some of which were forwarded to the Zoning Board of Appeals.
- Reviewing the Back Achers planned expansion
- Investigating the impact of the new Cannabis Law since the Town of Torrey **did not** opt out by December 31,2021.

From the Desk of Town Judge (Hon. George Thompson)

- Court is held each Tuesday at 2:00pm on the West side of the Town Building. The phone number is 315 536 5655
- Criminal court is held the second Tuesday of the month at 2:00 pm
- Town Board members Peter Martini and Colby Petersen audited the Town Justice books and found no discrepancies for Judge George R. Thompson, September 1, 2020 - August 31,2021
- Town Court is applying for a **JCAP** Grant to finance installation of a Security system for the building and courtroom.
- Another responsibility of the Town Judge is CAP court.
CAP or Central Arraignment Part Court is held daily at 8AM and 6PM everyday in a classroom off the lobby at the jail. The judges rotate on call duty throughout the month. The purpose is to avoid calling a judge out anytime , day or night, to arraign a person arrested and needing to be told by a judge of what they are accused. A public defender and a district attorney attend and make recommendations about potential bail, release on recognizance or probation department stay in touch conditions following the new cash bail reform legislative changes. Also a judge may be asked to make a decision on whether to issue Orders of Protection, either stay away or refrain from, in domestic incidents where victim safeguards are called for. Town

justices also can be called upon to hear a request to issue search warrants, to hear small claims cases for up to \$3,000, conduct hearings on eviction and squatter claims of landlords. Violations of almost any law, conservation violations, are first heard in Town Justice Court. Felony crimes are tried in the higher courts after review of the charge(s) before a Grand Jury.

From the Desk of Town Watershed Inspector (*Yates Cty Soil & Water*)

The Town's inspectors can be contacted at the Yates County Soil and Water Conservation Department 315- 536-5188.

In November of 2014, the Town of Torrey passed a local Wastewater Law effective January 1, 2015. Under the new law, any onsite wastewater treatment system within 200' of Seneca Lake or a DEC classified stream is required to be inspected every 5 years. The cost of the inspection is borne by the Town of Torrey (unless this is a property transfer). However any pumping of the septic or repair is a cost to the homeowner. We are now in year 6 of these inspections.
